A. Blake (Sd) Signed sealed and declared to be the testators last Will & Testament in the presence of us (Signed) James Bay, Jas. Melis, Ripen Mohun Bhow of Bang Baraz.

Additional Clause to my Will from the circumstance of my property and cash funds being partly in India and partly in England and considering that some time may elapse before the amount thereof might be realized and collected for payment and distribution as bequeathed in my Will I do hereby empower my Executors hereinafter named that they will immediately on the realization of every item or sum of my property either the same shall amount to 1000 £ in England and 5000 Rs in India place or invest the same in the Government funds for security and for the eventual benefit of those provided in the disposition of my Will and Testament WITNESS my hand this 10th day of February in the year of our Lord above written G. A. Blake (Sd)

Copy of my last Will and Testament left in the hands of Messrs Alexander & Co my agents at Calcutta G. A. Blake Feb 1829.

Proved at London with a Codicil 7th April 1830 before the Worshipful John Adams Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the Oaths of Charles Edward & George Blake Esq the Brother & George Ballard Esq two of the Executors to whom Administration was granted limited until the Original Will & Codicil or a more authentic Copy thereof shall be brought into and left in the Registry of the prerogative Court of Canterbury having been first sworn duly to Administer - Power reserved of making the like Oath to John Archer Esq the other Executor whom he shall apply for the same - The Original Will & Codicil being in the hands of Messrs Alexander & Co the Deceaseds Agents at Calcutta in the East Indies as by Acts of Court appears.

In the Name of God Amen. I Catharine Butcher of Diga Goblow in the County of Middlesex Widow being of sound and disposing mind first I will and direct that all my Just Debts and Testamentary charges and expences may be paid in the first instance by my Executors hereinafter named and my funeral to be private not expensive and a walking one I will and bequeath to my dear Daughter Caroline Butcher my watch Trinkets & Household furniture and plate likewise I will and bequeath to my dear Daughter Caroline Butcher all my Interest and Dividends on Bank Stock Long Annuities and Three and half per cent Consols as are invested in my name in the bank of England for and during her natural life and after her decease I give and bequeath one third share of the principal which paid the same to the said Caroline lawfully begotten and the other two thirds to my Sons George Butcher and Henry Butcher or the Survivors or Survivor I give and bequeath my House in the occupation of Mrs Matthews and Mr Wiggins in the Diga Street Paragon of Southwark one third share of the rents and profits of the same to my Daughter Caroline Butcher one third share of the rents and profits of the same to my son George Butcher and one third share of the rents and profits of the same to my son Henry Butcher in case of the death of either for the benefit of the survivor or survivors giving the said survivor the full possession of the said two Houses and I do

 charges) And I do Acoby nominate constitute and appoint my said dear Wife
 Mary Berry Executrix and my brother James Berry Executor of this
 my last Will and Testament and Guardians of my children during their minority
 and it is my Will that my said Executor shall not be charged or chargeable
 with or answerable or accountable for any more of my monies personal estate
 or effects than he shall actually receive or shall come to his hands by virtue of
 this my Will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 third day of September One thousand eight hundred and twenty nine *William Berry (Sd)*
 signed Sealed published and declared by the within named William Berry the
 Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his
 presence at his request and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed
 our names as witnesses *Henry Offord* - *Jam^r Boutell* - *John Berry*

 Mary Berry Widow the Heir & James Berry the Brother the Executors to
 whom Admin^r was granted having been first sworn by Commission duly to
 Administer.

 Chivalier in the County of Derby Esq^r deceased) do by virtue of all powers and
 authorities in any wise enabling me make this my last Will and
 Testament or writing in the nature thereof in manner following I give to
 my son the Rev^d Richard Rowland Dean the sum of one hundred pounds
 I give to my Daughter Mary Emma Clayton the sum of five hundred
 pounds to my Grand Daughter Ellen Buckton the like sum of five hundred
 pounds and to my Grand Daughter Mary Emma Mosby the like sum of
 five hundred pounds which three last mentioned Legacies I direct to be paid
 to my said Daughter and Grand Daughters respectively or their Dominions
 for their separate use independently of their respective husbands and that
 their respective shares shall be good discharges for the same respectively I give
 to my Great Grandson Arthur Mosby the sum of five hundred pounds
