 March Anno Dni one thousand six hundred fiftie two Richard Barber of
 Roman gate in the parish of St. Lawrence in the Isle of Chancery and County of Kent
 fisherman doo make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme
 following First I bequeth my soule into the hands of Almighty God who made it and my
 bodie to the earth to be buried according to the discretion of my Exorsors hereafter
 named from I give unto my poore widdowes of Roman gate five shillings and unto
 five poore widdowes in the parish five shillings more to be paid with my one moneth
 after my decease by my Exorsors according to their discretion from I give unto Richard
 the sonne of my late sonne Richard Barber and to the heires of his bodie lawfully begotten
 my house with the herringe house land and appurtenances therunto belonging (one
 halfe of the well excepted) now in the occupation of Elizabeth Curlinge widdow
 if hee dye without heires of his bodie lawfully begotten then I give the sayd house
 and premises unto Ellen and Morris my daughter and to their heires for ever equally
 to be divided betwene them from I will that Alexander Longe my sonne in law
 shall have the letting and receiving the profite of the sayd house and premises
 to and for the use of the sayd Richard my grandchild until hee shall accomplish his
 age of one and twenty yeares from I give unto Dorothy my wife for and during the
 terme of her naturall life one smale thatcht house wherin I now dwelle from
 I give unto my sayd wife halfe my household stuffe (two bodys excepted) and also halfe
 a chaldron of coales and four busshells of wheate from I give unto my sayd
 wife for the terme of her life one annuities or yearly Rent charge of forty shillings
 to be issuing and going out of the house and premises before given to my grandchild
 Richard Barber and to be paid unto her at two foote in the yeare by equal portion
 six) at St. Michael the Archangel and the annuities of our blessed virgin Mary the first
 payment thereof to begin at that feast of the feast which shall next happen after my
 decease from I give unto my daughter of my sayd sonne Richard aforesaid wife of my
 sayd wife for the house aforesaid to have and to hold the same unto the sayd Richard
 and her heires for ever from I will that the sayd Richard and her heires for ever shall have
 the use of the well aforesaid with four missets and six and sixpence and from I give
 at all tymes as often as occasion shall require from I use the annuities or yearly Rent
 charge of forty shillings before granted to my sayd wife to be behind and unpaid from dayes
 after any of the sayd feastes in which it ought to be paid as aforesaid from I give full
 liberty to and for my sayd wife or her assignes to enter upon the house and premises
 out of which the same is issuing and distringne and to distringne and distresse her
 heires and taken to beare and carry away and the same to delivne and keep until shee
 of the sayd yearly Rent charge and all arrears thereof (if any happen to be) be
 fully satisfied contented and paid from I give unto my daughter Mary Longe now
 wife of Alexander Longe and to her heires for ever all that my other house with the
 land as it is now bounded out and appurtenances therunto belonging now in the
 occupation of John Chapman together with halfe the well before excepted paying unto
 Richard Morris and Sarah the daughter of Ellen Dorn now wife of Henry Dorn
 five and twenty pounds with six moneths after their sayd Mothers decease in
 manner following (videlicet) to Richard five pounds and unto Morris and Sarah
 ten pounds a peece and if any of them dye before, then his or her part to be paid to the
 survivors or survivor of them and paying in the interim unto the sayd Ellen her Mother
 profite for her sayd twenty five pounds according to the rate of five pounds per annu for her
 life all the residue of my goods and chattels I give unto the sayd Alexander Longe and
 to the sayd Ellen Dorn whom I make Exorsors of this my last will and testament and
 whosoever shall make any disturbance herein shall take no benefit by it for with the residue
 of hand hereunto put my hand and seale Dated the day and year first above written Richard
 Barber his mark Sealid and acknowledged to be the last will and testament of the
 sayd Richard Barber in the presence of Richard Bennett Esq. Exors.

This Will was proved at Westminster the fourth day of July one thousand
 six hundred fiftie three before the Judges for probate of wills and granting Administrations
 according to an Act of Parliament intituled an Act for probate of wills and granting of Ad-
 ministrations by the Oathes of Sir John Longe and Eldred the Executors therein named
 to whom Administration of all and singular the goods chattells and debts of the said deceased
 which any manner of way toucheth the same will was granted and committed they being
 first legally sworn by virtue of a Commission in that behalf issued forth well and fairly fully to
 administer the same.

I Barnabie Butcher of the County of Kent Miller being sick and weak in body but of good
 Land and good memory praise be to Almighty God for the same do make and
 ordaine this my last will and Testament the first day of April in the year
 of our Lord one thousand six hundred fiftie and third first of will and bequeath
 my soule into the hande of Almighty God hoping through the merittes of Jesus
 Christ my Saviour to obteyne Eternal life and my body to the Earth to be buried
 at the will of my Executor hereafter named when it shall please God to call for me
 out of this life I give and bequeath unto my Aunt Katherine Butcher of the County
 of Essex widow the full summe of forty shillings of good lawfull monny of England
 to be paid unto her within two weekes next after my decease by my Executor hereafter
 named Item I give and bequeath unto George Butcher my Sonne one of four
 poundes of my Aunt Butcher before mentioned forty shillings of good and lawfull
 monny of England to be paid unto him by my Executor hereafter named within two
 weekes next following after my decease Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Butcher
 my Sister heire of good and lawfull monny of England to be paid unto her by my
 Executor hereafter named when shee shall demand the same All the rest of my
 goods Chattells house hold stuffe monny stock and goods whatsoever my debts and
 legacies being paid and my funerall expences discharged I give and bequeath
 unto my Kinsman Edward Butcher of the County of Essex aforesaid hundred shillings
 of new and old silver and my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament to be written
 in one sheet of paper and to be published the same day and likewise have hereunto sett
 my hand and seal the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand six
 hundred fiftie and third in the presence of the witnesses hereafter named Barnabie
 Butcher, Robert Swales, Robert Swales and publick Justice of the Peace of the County of Kent
 What cometh

This Will was proved at Westminster the first day of July in the year of our
 Lord God one thousand six hundred fiftie three before the Judges for probate of wills
 granting of Administrations according to an Act of Parliament intituled an Act for
 probate of wills and granting of Administrations by the Oath of Edward Butcher Esq
 Kinsman of the said deceased and sole Executor therein named to whom Administration of all
 and singular the goods chattells and debts of the said deceased which any manner of way toucheth
 the same will was granted and committed they being first legally sworn by virtue of
 a Commission in that behalf issued forth well and truly to administer the same.
